

SITES TO VISIT

Old Dam:

Built in the late 1800s, this stone dam once powered many of Manlius' grain mills.

Limestone Creek:

Named for the sedimentary bedrock that makes up its banks, the creek runs through the park, marking one side of its border.

Tom Whorrall Pavilion:

This Pavilion is named for Thomas Whorrall, who was a former Police Chief of Manlius, and who dedicated endless hours to maintaining the park.

Mill Run is a carry in/carry out park.

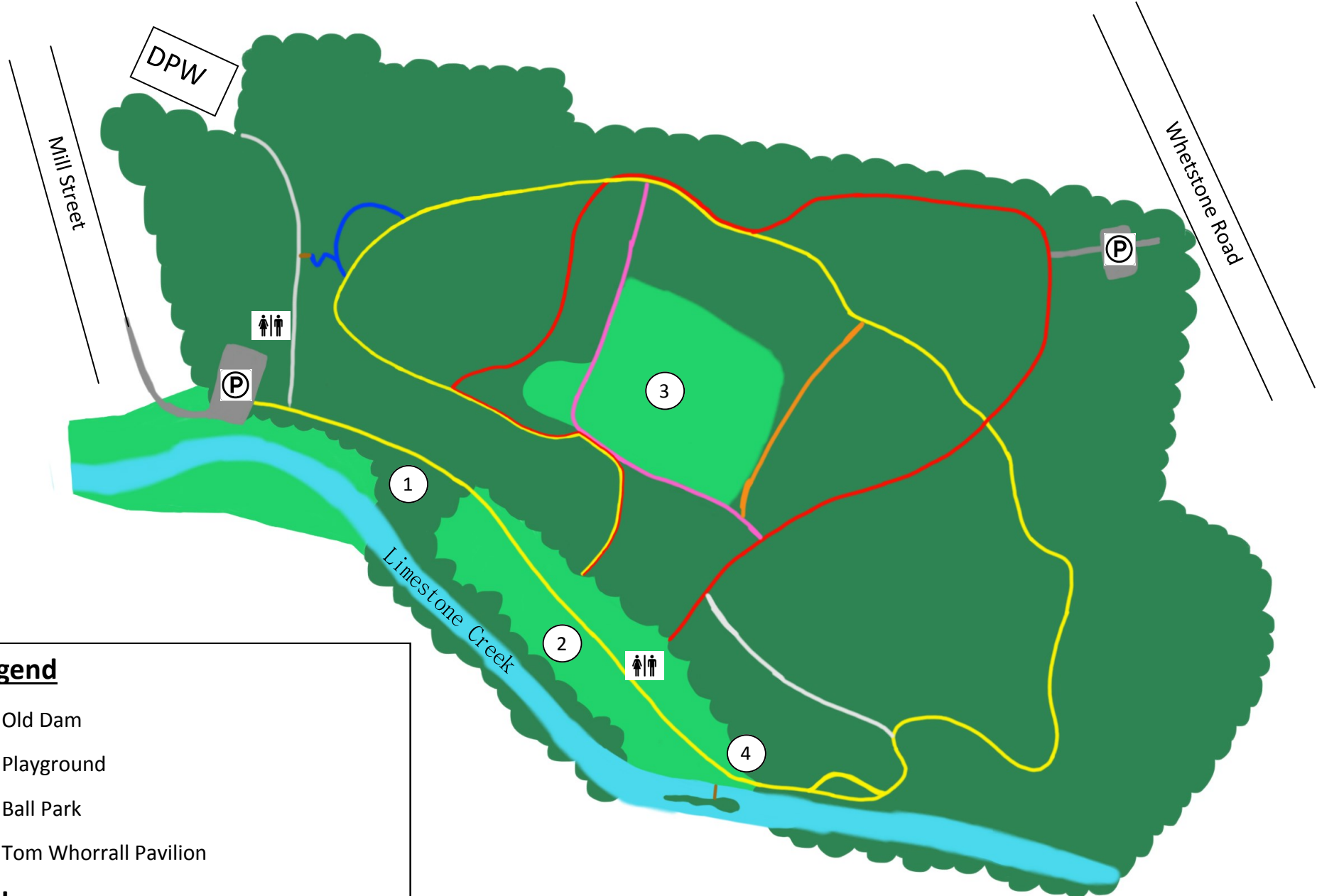
Please be sure to remove garbage and dispose of it properly.

MILL RUN PARK MANLIUS

Mill Run Park is 39 acres of land that was originally targeted to be an apartment complex. Luckily this never happened, as Adele Nelson, a widow who lived on Whetstone Road, sold her land to the village of Manlius in 1977.

Trails were developed in the park, and playground equipment added. Thomas Whorrall and a summer youth crew he lead, maintained the park for many years.

Today the park is open from dawn to dusk for all the public to enjoy.
